

The park is open on a limited basis:

The playground is closed.

The bathrooms are closed and secured.

The water supply is not available.

Tent camping is not permitted.

RV camping is permitted only in totally self contained units and only on every other site.

Picnic tables are secured in the pavilion and are not available for use, except for one table at each permitted RV site.

Our camp hosts, Pam and Larry Horlitz have their camper in the park and are on location managing the situation as best as they can to keep the park as safe as possible for everyone to enjoy during these difficult times. They have also made and placed informative signs to assist the public in understanding the situation.

The Pepin county sheriff and his deputies appear happy with these proactive measures and have indicated they intend to have a bigger presence in the park to help keep the park a safe place.

Other Stuff:

Sites 12 - 16 which were relocated from the lake front area to along the park entrance road are fully functional with newly graveled pads and upgraded 50 amp electrical service at each site. Plans will need to be developed to turn the space vacated by these sites near the lake front into a public green area.

The spring clean-up was done by Chris Hines and Rebecca Pope. They did a great job and the park looks as nice as it does because of their efforts.

Property line issue: It has been determined that the park neighbors, Tod and Dana Wollschlager actually own the pond, the road that parallels the pond, and about 20 feet into the tent area of the park. The village owns property extending down the road that leads to Tod and Dana's house. Harley and the Wollschlagers have negotiated a land swap that appears to benefit both parties. the details of the land swap will be presented to the planning commission and village board at meetings in the next two weeks for approval.

Park Internet: HBC is scheduled to provide internet service to the park this spring. I will work to coordinate this with HBC and our park hosts to get the installation completed ASAP.

Park well: Earlier this spring the Dunn County Health Department sent a letter stating that the park well is out of compliance with two deficiencies: 1) The system is required to have a back flow preventer installed to prevent a possible cross-contamination with an outside source. 2) The system also needs a smooth-end sample tap installed. Collins' plumbing has been contacted and returned an estimate of \$120 to do the work. I will arrange to have

Collins' Plumbing do the work and confirm the completion with Dunn County as requested by the Dunn County Health Department.
